

After the elections earlier this year, many of the States' Governors have constituted their cabinets and some are already revising or putting together their States' Economic Development Plan and Strategy Documents. The usual promise is to improve the socio-economic status of the citizens of a State in the next four years and beyond.

To objectively measure the extent of progress a new administration will be making and set measurable and realistic targets, there is a need to provide baseline data, capturing the current level of the socio-economic performance of a State. Such data are often not easily made available, and when they are, they may not be in easy-to-understand, readily usable, and comparable formats. This Scorecard, therefore, seeks to fill this gap.

Specifically, the most recent and available socio-economic data on the Nigerian 36 States and the FCT are analyzed and aggregated into a Performance Scorecard, showing the relative ranking of the States. The aim is to provide baseline data and highlight the relative performance of, and aid effective policymaking at, the sub-national level of government in Nigeria.

A total of 57 relevant indicators are used in the construction of the Scorecard across 12 key broad socio-economic segments; namely: i) Economic Output; ii) Government Finance; iii) Financial Sector; iv) Capital Importation; v) Land, Housing and Sanitation; vi) Transportation; vii) ICT Infrastructure; viii) Energy and Environment; ix) Industrialisation and Business Competitiveness; x) Education; xi) Health; and xii) Citizens' Livelihood and Welfare.

The most recent values on each of these 57 indicators are compared and the States and FCT ranked from 1 to 37 depending on how well they perform relative to one another. These ranks are then averaged across the indicators for each state and FCT under the relevant segment as shown in equation (1); where S_s^i represents the average rank for State s under segment i, I represents the indicators and j the number of indicators in the relevant segment.

$$S_s^i = \frac{\sum I_j}{i} \tag{1}$$

Given that the maximum possible score is 37, the outcome of equation (1) is therefore expressed in percentage as shown in equation (2); where $\overline{S_s^i}$ is the score used in States Scorecard, ranging between 0 and 100 for State s under segment i.

$$\overline{S_s^i} = 100 \times \frac{S_s^i}{37} \tag{2}$$

Since States are not isolated from the general trend of these indictors at the national level, the final score is adjusted by calculating an equally-weighted average of the nation's and each State's scores on the respective segments.
